LOCAL PLAN FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION

STUDENTS PLACED BY DISTRICTS IN NON-PUBLIC NON-SECTARIAN SCHOOLS

The Tri-Valley SELPA is a member of the Bay Area Consortium (BAC), and as such, participates with other Bay Area SELPAs in the development of a Master Contract to be used when students are placed by member districts in non-public, non-sectarian schools. The Master Contract requires the NPSs to follow all applicable state and federal laws pertaining to the education of students with disabilities, and to follow the applicable policies and procedures of the placing district, including the provision of a free and appropriate public education to students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs).

Each student placed by a district in a non-public school will be assigned a program specialist or other certificated staff member by the placing district, who will oversee the education and IEP implementation of the IEP by the NPS. District staff members will attend all IEP meetings for NPS students and will, no less than twice per year, review the IEP progress reports provided by the NPS to assure that the student is making meaningful progress on IEP goals.
